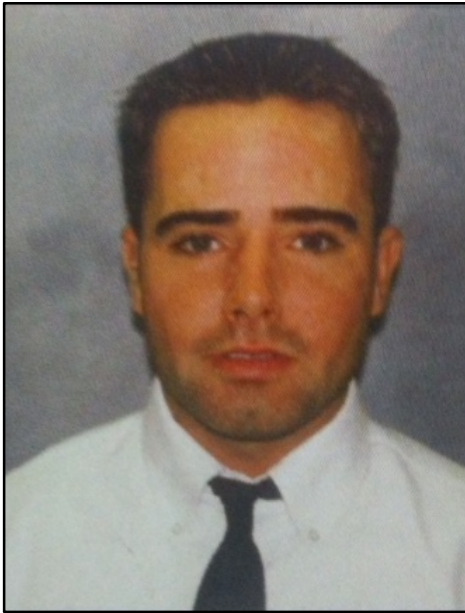


NICK SABOL



Nick Sabol began a lifetime career in golfing during his high school years at Freedom Area. During his time at Freedom, Nick was a two-time All-Sate finalist, three-time WPIAL medalist, 1993 Kings Junior Player of the Year, 1994 United States Junior Amateur, and he earned the 1994 CJ Betters Scholarship Award.

Nick continued his education and was a four-year member of the Catawba College men's golf team where he is considered one of the best golfers in the college's history. He was a four-time All-South Atlantic Conference (SAC) First Team selection from 1995-1999, earning both SAC Player and Freshman of the Year honors in 1995. He also led Catawba to its first SAC Men's Golf Championship and first golf title since 1973. The 1995 team was the first men's golf team to compete in the NCAA Division II National Tournament. During Nick's career, the Catawba Indians were SAC

Tournament Champions twice in 1995 and 1998, and they were SAC runner-up in 1996 and 1997.

Individually, Nick was the SAC Tournament Champion in 1995, posting the best round in Catawba history by a freshman or at a SAC Tournament, with a 66 in the second round of the tournament. He was named a National Golf Coaches Association (NGCA) honorable mention All-American in 1995 and 1998. He was also named the NGCA Division II Freshman of the Year in 1995, and in 1997, he was an Academic All-District selection. During his career, Nick won four tournaments, posted a career scoring average of 75.33 in 113 rounds, had 23 top-10 finishes, completed 12 rounds under par, had 62 rounds with a score of 75 or lower, and had 23 rounds of par or better. The best season of his career came in 1998, when he posted a 74.32 scoring average and advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championship as an individual.

Nick has previously been inducted into the Catawba College Hall of Fame and the South Atlantic Conference Hall of Fame. He holds course records at Blackhawk Golf Course (64), Stonecrest Golf Course (63), and Ambridge Country Club (63).

Upon graduation from Catawba in 1998, Nick spent a year on the Hooters Mini-Tour before becoming a professional golf instructor. Currently, he is the professional golf instructor at the Rowan Road Driving Range in Cranberry Township.
